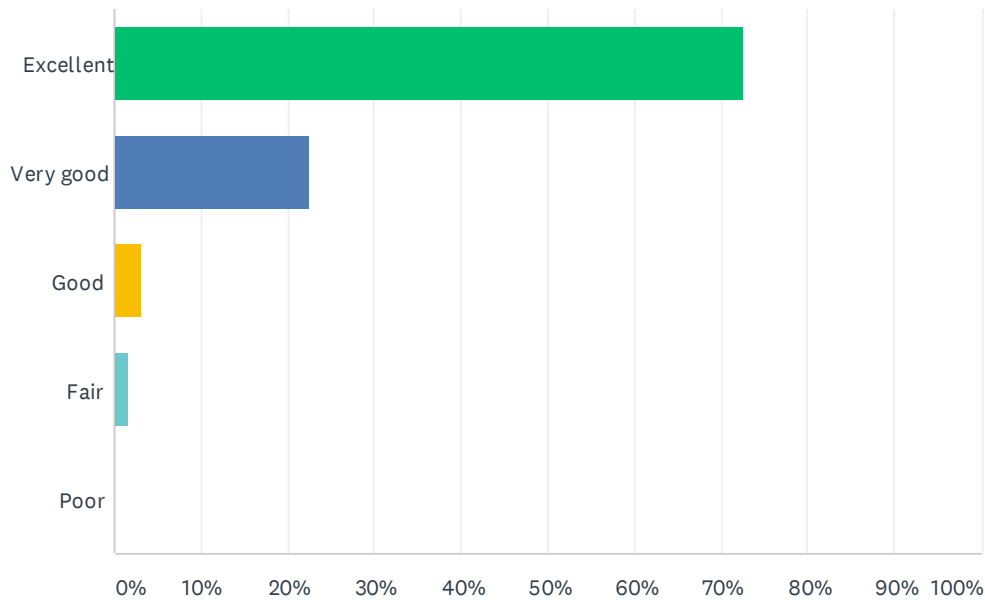


Q1 Overall, how would you rate the event?
